**PSYC-3533. Introduction to Industrial and Organizational Psychology (BUSI 3513)**

Introduction to Industrial and Organizational Psychology (I/O) is a course that provides students with a comprehensive understanding of the principles and practices of I/O psychology. The course covers topics such as employee selection, training, performance appraisal, and organizational behavior. It is designed for students who are interested in careers in human resources, organizational development, and related fields. The course is offered in both fall and spring semesters. Prerequisites: PSYC 2613, 2623, 2643.

**PSYC-3613. Models of Psychotherapy with Adults**

Models of Psychotherapy with Adults is a course that explores the theoretical foundations and practical applications of various psychotherapeutic approaches. Students will learn about the history and evolution of psychotherapy, as well as the role of the therapist and the client. The course covers a range of models, including psychoanalytic, humanistic, cognitive-behavioral, and integrative approaches. It is designed for students who are interested in careers in counseling, clinical psychology, and related fields. The course is offered in both fall and spring semesters. Prerequisites: PSYC 2643.
