Personal Safety

Pets

Quiet Hours

Quiet hours are in effect from 10:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. on weekdays and 12:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on weekends and holidays.

On 1/1/2014, the University of St. Thomas implemented a smoke-free policy on all campus residences. This policy was implemented to protect the health of all students and staff. The policy prohibits smoking in all campus residences, including dormitories, student centers, and faculty residences. The policy also prohibits smoking in all campus buildings, including classrooms, offices, and libraries. The policy is effective for all students and staff who live or work on campus.
