SOCI-2443. Racialization and Ethnicity (PEAC)

This course examines the social construction of race and ethnicity, and the ways in which these categories are used to create and maintain social hierarchies. It explores the historical and contemporary processes of racialization and ethnicization, and the role of these processes in the formation of national and global identities. SOCI-2513. Sociology of Communication
