An 18 credit hours in Native Studies is stufficient to constitute a Minor in Native Studies.

NATI-3313. Contemporary Issues in Native/Non-Native Relations

NATI-3503. Advanced Research Strategies in Native Studies

This course will e_a mine $_a$ dv $_a$ nced rese $_a$ rch methods of p_a rticul $_a$ r use in rese $_a$ rch with indigenous popul $_a$ tions. Noth qu_a lit $_a$ tive $_a$ nd qu_a ntit $_a$ tive methods will be covered, $_a$ lthough one or the other m_a be emph $_a$ si ed in $_a$ n p_a rticul $_a$ r semester. Prerequisite: NATI 2503 Rese $_a$ rch Str $_a$ tegies in N_a tive Studies.

NATI-3603. Native People and the Colonial Experience

This course will look at colonialism as a strateg of imperialism and as a model for understanding North American Native histor . Dierent tipes of colonialism will be eiplored, i.e. classic, internal, and neocolonialism, and an emphasis will be placed on the histor and continuing impact of colonialism on Indigenous peoples and cultures of North America. The course will also anale e Christian missions, the fur trade, and colonial government policies, as well as eiploitation, racism, war, indoctrination, genocide, and cultural appropriation as manifestations of colonialism. Responses to colonialism, including resistance and decoloniation, will also be considered. Prerequisite: NATI 1006.

NATI-3613. Native Resistance and Liberation

Focuses on the $m_{\partial}n$ historic_{∂}l $_{\partial}$ nd contempor_{∂}r forms of N_{∂} tive resist_{∂}nce to coloni $_{\partial}$ tion, including violent $_{\partial}$ nd non-violent resist_{∂}nce, revit_{∂}li $_{\partial}$ tion movements, $_{\partial}$ nd self-determin_{∂}-tion. E plores liber_{∂}tion theor $_{\partial}$ nd its roots in coloni $_{\partial}$ l oppression. An_{∂}l es historic_{∂}l $_{\partial}$ nd contempor_{∂}r resist_{∂}nce movements such $_{\partial}$ s the Ghost D_{∂} nce Movement, the Riel Rebellion, the sh-ins, the confront_{∂}tions $_{\partial}$ t Wounded Knee $_{\partial}$ nd Ok_{∂} , $_{\partial}$ nd the movement for decolo-

ni ation through self-determination. Prerequisite: NATI 3603 or b special permission of the instructor.

NATI-3623. Native Education and Colonization

This course will e_a mine tr_a dition_al forms and philosophies of educ_ation in N_a tive societies, and the changes that have occurred since contact and coloni ation. It will also e_a mine the formal educ_ation of N_a tives e_a the immigrant societ as indoctrination for civili ation and assimilation. It will look closel at residential and e_a schools in e_a 0 and the United e_a 1 tention will be given to the relationship between educ_ation and cultural survival, and the importance for e_a 1 tive people to reclaim and control the educ_ation of their children. Prerequisite: NATI 3603 or permission of the instructor.

NATI-3633. Maliseet/Passamaquoddy History

NATI-3803. Indigenous Cultures and Immigrant Ethnic Minorities

This course e_a mines the dierent situations and conditions of Indigenous cultures and immigrant ethnic minorities in $C_a n_a d_a$ and the treatment of $e_a ch$ be dierent levels of government. Special attention is given to attitudes, perceptions, and the idea of multiculturalism. Emphasi es the importance of power variables in the e_a mination of immigrant and Indigenous relations in $C_a n_a di_a n$ societ. Also e_a mines how immigrant ethnic minorities often form co_a litions becoming the dominant culture subordinating Indigenous cultures. Prerequisite: NATI 1006 or SOCI 1006.

NATI-3813. Native Cultural Identity and Cultural Survival (HMRT)

Considers cultur_al identit and surviv_al within the contett of inequ_alit (power, we_alth and st_atus). Focuses on the w_a is in which N_ative l_angu_age, group solid_arit and communit of er cultur_al completeness, acting as b_arriers to assimil_ation. Historic and contempor_ar N_ative cultures are presented as dinamic and we lible. Prerequisite NATI 1006 or SOCI 1006.

NATI-3823. Native Peoples and the Canadian Form of Racism (HMRT)

The indigenous peoples of $C_a n_a d_a$ are often included $_a s$ an $_a$ fterthought in $_a c_a$ demic works on r_a cism, which tend to focus on r_b ck-White rel_a tions. However, r_a ther $th_a n$ being $m_a r ginal$ to underst and ing the issues of $r_a c e_a n d r_a c i s m$, the $e_a r l$ encounters between European and N_a tive Americans are central to its proper underst and ing. The issues which arose from Columbus' e plorations $rem_a i n_a s$ central to underst and ing modern $r_a c i s m_a s$ the were to the creation of $r_a c i s$ ideolog in the rst $pl_a c e_a$ and the $t re_a t m e n t$ of indigenous peoples in $c_a n_a d_a$ to d_a is shown to be a direct intellectual descendent of the $m_a t e rial$ need to den the humanit of other human beings.

NATI-3843. Suicide and Indigenous Peoples

NATI-3853. Alcohol, Drugs, and Indigenous Peoples

NATI-4633. The Archaeology of First Nations History In Canada: Practice

This course is intended to follow NATI 4623 $_{a}$ nd focus on the period 1900 to the present. Students will be e pected to $\operatorname{rese}_{a}\operatorname{rch}_{a}\operatorname{p}_{a}\operatorname{rticul}_{a}\operatorname{r}$ topic within the context of $\operatorname{C}_{a}\operatorname{n}_{a}\operatorname{di}_{a}\operatorname{n}$ histor, identify what $\operatorname{h}_{a}\operatorname{s}$ been left out, and explicate which this is likely the $\operatorname{C}_{a}\operatorname{se}$. Students will also $\operatorname{Ie}_{a}\operatorname{rn}$ to access and $\operatorname{ev}_{a}\operatorname{Iu}_{a}\operatorname{te}_{a}$ broad $\operatorname{v}_{a}\operatorname{riet}$ of sources including archives, or altraditions, and internet sources. Prerequisite: NATI 4623.

NATI-4996. Honours Thesis

NATI-4123. Introduction to Native Language Immersion Immersion Teaching I

This introductor course in immersion te_aching focuses on tr_aining squent spe_akers of Mi'km_aq or M_aliseet/P_ass_am_aquodd to te_ach using their own l_angu_age _as the l_angu_age of instruction. The course surve s rese_arch _and pr_actice in N_ative l_angu_age immersion educ_ation _and focuses on the development of cultur_all relev_ant curriculum _and te_aching m_ateri_als for Mi'km_aq _and M_aliseet/P_ass_am_aquodd immersion cl_assrooms. Includes _also _a linguistic component focusing on structures _and concepts in e_ach l_angu_age. Fluenc in Mi'km_aq or M_aliseet/P_ass_am_aquodd .

Skills Development Courses

NATI-3453. Teaching Adult Immersion

Using rese_arch in second-l_angu_age _acquisition, this course identi es speci c immersion methods for te_aching _a N_ative l_angu_age _as _a second l_angu_age to _adults. It emph_asi es the or_al _appro_ach for developing convers_ation_al —quenc _and considers me_ans for _assessing students, est_ablishing _appropri_ate go_als, _and ev_alu_ating le_arning in b_asic convers_ation. Fluenc in M_aliseet or Mi'km_aq is required. Prerequisite: NATI 4123 N_ative L_angu_age Immersion Te_aching, or b speci_al permission.

NATI-3463. Immersion for Kindergarten

This course focuses on str_ategies for te_aching _all subject _are_as in the mother-tongue, p_articul_arl to children who come from English-spe_aking homes. It p_a s p_articul_ar _attention to methods for _achieving —µenc , with speci_al _attention to te_aching pre-prim_ar liter_ac _and numer_ac skills. The course will _also consider cultur_all _appropri_ate te_aching st les _and curriculum pl_anning, in rel_ation to the ph sic_al, soci_al, _and emotion_al development of the kinderg_arten child. Prerequisite: NATI 4123 N_ative L_angu_age Immersion Te_aching, or b speci_al permission.

Linguistics Courses

NATI-3113. Conversational Maliseet/Passamaquoddy

NATI-4006. Structure of Native Languages

This course e amines the structure of Mi'kmaq and Maliseet from a linguistic and literar perspective. What are the signicant features of these languages, and how do the determine the unique cultural outlook of those who speak them? Students e plore the structure of Mi'kmaq and Maliseet and e amine the dierences between these languages and English. The course will also look at problems of translation, and the criteria and methods for the production of te tsand other materials in Native language. Prerequisite: permission of the instructor. Consideration will be given to the student's level of competence in speaking and understanding the Mi'kmaq or Maliseet language.

NATI-4213. Morphology in the Target Language I

Morpholog is the description of $gr_{\partial}mm_{\partial}tic_{\partial}l$ forms in $_{\partial}l_{\partial}ngu_{\partial}ge$. As such this course studies the intern $_{\partial}l$ structure of words. NATI-4223. Phonology in the Target Language I

Phonolog is the stud of gener_al phonetics in rel_ation to the sound s stem of $_{\partial}$ l_angu_age. Focusing on the t_arget First N_ation l_angu_age it will consider the reproduction of sounds, p_articul_arl conson_ants and vowels, and stud the v_arious orthogr_aphies (writing s stems) of the l_angu_age. Prerequisite: NATI 2103, Intermedi_ate Mi'km_aq, or NATI 2113, Intermedi_ate M_aliseet/P_ass_am_aquodd or the equiv_alent, or $_{\Delta}$ enc in the l_angu_age.

NATI-4233. Verbs in the Target Language I

This course will anale everb stems, animate and inanimate, transitive and intransitive verbs, and additional structural elements including person, tense, singular, plural, negative and formative, in indicative, conjunct and imperative forms. Prerequisite: NATI 1103, reginning Mi'kmaq, or NATI 1113, reginning Maliseet/Passamaquodd, or the equivalent, or spend in the language.

NATI-4323. Phonology in the Target Language II

This course is intended $prim_a ril$ for students in $_a n$ intensive $l_a ngu_a ge le_a rning program. It will provide <math>pr_a ctic_a l$ e perience with elements of Phonolog in the $T_a rget L_a ngu_a ge l$, with special emphasis on $re_a ding_a nd$ writing. Pre-requisites $_a re$ NATI 4223 Phonolog in the $T_a rget L_a ngu_a ge l$.

NATI-4253. Advanced Maliseet/Passamaguoddy I

This course focuses on the $gr_a mm_a tic_a l p_a tterns_a nd processes in the M_aliseet/P_ass_am_a-quodd l_angu_age, and how the are put into use in comprehension and conversation. Pitch accent and advanced verb forms such as relative, subordinative, inverse, inde nite subject, conjunct and obviation will be considered. Prerequisites: Either NATI 2113 Intermediate M_aliseet/P_ass_am_aquodd, or NATI 3113 Conversational M_aliseet, or the equivalent.$

NATI-4263. Verbs in The Target Language II

This course builds on knowledge of verb forms t_aught in NATI-4233 _and introduces more comple forms such _as the true plur_al, ch_anged _and unch_anged conjunct, inverse forms,
