St ents with T ŒFLs ores of 88-8 (Internet se), 230 (omp ter se), 570 (p perse) or MELABs ore of 80 or n IELTS s ore of 6.5 or gre ter re eligible to t ke ave reg | r emi o rses t m yt ke integr te n ssiste o rses if they wish.

Regulations

St ents who wint to le ve the progrim efore they hive implete it mist onvine the Dire tor this they hive the require English I ng ige skills by hieving grie of on their I st ESL or rise in one of the following siones on nextern I test 60 on the EL 230 on TOEFL (ompiter selections) or 88 on TOEFL BT. The test is via like to Sint John ollege it UNB-Sint John, NB in TOEFL tests reviable in Sixville, NB in Hilfit, NS. St ents mist in nge in ply for these tests themselves.
- 3. St ents m st s essf lly p ss the rst-ye r o rses efore moving on st ent who f ils the rst-ye r o rses twi e is et l e from the ESL progr m. These st ents wo l e eligible to re pply to St. Thom s University when they n emonstr te th t their English l ng ge skills re stronger.
- 4. St ents t king o rses in the ESL progr m re restri te to tot I of 15 re it ho rs per semester. In e_τ eption I ses, the Dire tor m y permit st ent to e_τ ee this o rse lo .

ESL-2223. Advanced English for Academic Purposes II
