Adjunct Research Professorships are positions which enable the University to benefit from the expertise of individuals who hold, or have held, professorships at other universities but who are not in the employ of St. Thomas University. Adjunct Research Professors are appointed to a department or academic unit to assist in program development being carried out therein or to assist in major departmental research projects.

## **Appointment Procedures**

- 1. On behalf of a department of academic unit, a Chairperson or Program Director may submit a written nomination for the appointment of an Adjunct Research Professor to the Vice-President (Academic & Research). The nomination shall include a current curriculum vitae, a description of the candidate's qualifications, and an indication of the research or program development activities on which the candidate will be working, along with a summary of the specific contributions he or she is expected to make. Candidates will normally be in possession of a Ph.D. or have completed equivalent scholarly work, and will have achieved distinction in their field.
- 2. The Vice-President (Academic & Research) shall forward the nomination, along with his or her own recommendation, to the President. The decision to appoint shall rest with the President.
- 3. The term of appointment is normally three years, but may be shorter where warranted.
- 4. Appointments to the rank of Adjunct Research Professor may be renewed
